

Cricket Loams – Boughton Loam

When dressing cricket pitches after play has ceased, Boughton Loam produce various dressings to enable consistent compatibility with the original cricket loam used.

Boughton Loam dressings are guaranteed dry to enable easy spreading either by hand or through mechanical spreaders.

Boughton Club Cricket Dressing

A loam with a typical clay content of between 25-28%. Club loam is used at clubs that need a true firm pitch but do not have the resources to cope with a higher clay content loam.

Boughton County Cricket Dressing

A loam with typical clay content above 30% giving a firm true pitch able to last at least four days at a County Cricket level or to give a better surface to a higher standard Club.

Sterilised Kettering Loam

A loam with a typical clay content of 24%.

It is an ideal loam where a pitch is required to give a good surface while receiving a minimal amount of preparation.

Kaloam

Kaloam's high clay content gives the wicket its feel and character when played and its durability to be able to withstand the punishment of a hard season at the crease.
